- Trace the symbols for the Everglades in blue.


Part 2: Identifying States and Capitals

- The **Pearl River** flows from the middle of Mississippi to the Gulf of Mexico. Label it **8**. Trace it in blue.
- The **Chattahoochee River** flows from northern Georgia through Florida and into the Gulf of Mexico. Label it **9**. Trace it in blue.
- Lake Okeechobee lies in south central Florida. Label it 10. Color it blue.
- Cape Canaveral lies off the eastern coast of Florida. It is the site of space shuttle launches.

- The Mississippi Delta lies at the mouth of the Mississippi River in southern Louisiana. Label it 12.

- Kerr Reservoir lies in southern Virginia and northern North Carolina. Label it 9. Color it blue.
- The Roanoke River flows from Virginia through North Carolina. Label it 10. Trace it in blue.
- Kentucky Lake lies across the border between Tennessee and Kentucky. Label it 11. Color it blue.
- The **Tennessee River** flows through the Appalachian Mountains in eastern Tennessee. Label it **12**. Trace it in blue.
- The Savannah River forms the western border of South Carolina. Label it 13. Trace it in blue.
- The Outer Banks lie off the coast of North Carolina, Label them 14.
